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Q. What did you do to the front locks?

A. I changed the tumbler on the locks. I made it that there were to be two keys to gain entrance and to exit. In other words you need one key to open the front door, and you need a separate key to get out of the house and open the door from the inside.

Why ask if they did not know

Q. Was there an occasion when there was a piece of a broken key inside of that lock?

A. On Saturday after the murders, when the bodies were found, I went there to Millick St. to change the locks. When I arrived I noticed that there was a piece of a broken key on the inside lock, and took it out and placed the piece on the dining room table. I let Keith Smallwood know what I had found, and then Keith eventually told the detectives, and they recovered it.

Q. Prior to that Saturday night when was the last time that you had seen that particular lock?

A. I had seen it the weekend before. There was nothing wrong with the lock at that time.

Q. With a piece of a broken key inside of the lock, is it possible to disengage the lock?

A. No, because you could not get another key in.

Q. Did you have an occasion to go by 146 N. Millick St. in the morning hours of 3-21-97?

A. Yes, about a little after 7:00 A.M. I went there to do some work in the house.
