Q. Lt. would you please tell me what your tour of duty and assignment was on 3-22-97?

A. I was working the 4P-12A tour of duty and assigned to 19 Command. At approx 6:05 P.M. I responded to radio call from Pol. Prosser requesting a supervisor. Upon arrival at the scene, Pol. Prosser advised me that he went inside of 146 N. Millick St. and saw two people who were dead. I went inside the house with Pol. Soto. I checked the woman on the first floor, and saw that she was dead. She was face up, and she had clothes and rags over her, she also had a rag in her mouth. Then I went to the basement, and observed a second female at the bottom of the stairway. She was face up, and she was nude from the waist up, and she was tied behind her back. There was also a scar found her neck. We checked the entire house for suspects and more victims. The suspect or the individual who was in the house was already brought out of the house upon my arrival. I had him transported to the Homicide Division. I told the officers to take the children out of the house and they were subsequently transported to Homicide.
