Q. Officer, would you please tell me what your tour of duty and assignment was on this date?

A. I was working the 4P-11A tour of duty and assigned to 1901 EPW with my partner Pol. Evans # 5539. We responded to Pol. Prosser going over the air stating that he had two bodies inside of 146 N. Millick St. We went to that location, and upon arrival there were people on the scene, and there was a Black male who was in the back of 1918 RPP. We never entered the premises, we were directed by Sgt. Williams to transport a Black male identified as Darryl to the Homicide Division. We placed him in the wagon. While I was placing him in the wagon I had frisked him for safety reasons. He told me that he had stopped by the house to speak to a girl by the name of Rose, and he said that she was his friend. He said that someone was knocking on the door, and Rose told him to go upstairs and Pam came down from upstairs and he heard Pam Rose and some unknown male arguing downstairs. He said that he never saw the male or knew his name. He did not say when this happened.
