Q. Sarge, would you please tell me what your tour of duty and assignment was on this date?

A. I was working the 4P-11 tour of duty and assigned to 19 A. At approx. 6:05 P.M. I responded to 146 N. Millick St. When I got there a Black male was in the back of 1918 RPC. There were people at the scene, and Pol. Prosser was on the front porch. Pol. Prosser told me that there were two Black females in the house, one on the dining room floor, and one in the basement. I entered the residence, and I observed one Black female covered with clothes on the dining room floor near the basement steps. She was nude from the waist down, and I could not observe any injuries at that time. I went to the basement and I observed another Black female at the base of the stairs, and she was nude from the waist up, and she was tied behind her back, and she was lying face up. The girl in the dining room also had a cloth material in her mouth. I set up a crime scene, and I placed Pol. Pat Cannon to guard the scene. Pol. Prosser was assigned to the 75-48 on the case.
