Date: May 28, 1997

On Saturday, May 17, 1997, reporting agent arrived at the residence of Leo Sinnett and met with Sheriff's Office Captain Michael McCauley. Captain McCauley stated that the body had been examined by the Guernsey County Coroner and plans had already been made to send the body to the offices of the Franklin County Coroner for an autopsy. Captain McCauley pointed out the blood on the walls, some spatter groups and some drips. Captain McCauley stated the grandson had been outside mowing the lawn and had seen someone coming around the side of the house. The person got into a vehicle with two other people and left the scene. Captain McCauley stated that a strong box had been rifled through a bedroom of the home, and some of the dresser drawers had been disturbed as well. There appeared to be blood drops or smears on a dresser drawer near the handle. Captain McCauley requested assistance in processing the scene for potential evidence.

Reporting agent photographed the scene as found upon arrival. See the evidence submission sheet of corresponding number for a complete list of items collected and submitted to the BCI & I Laboratory in London, Ohio, for technical examination and interpretation.
