

1 I believe I made the light at 22nd and Jules, and I couldn't
2 say for sure she did or not, but that was it. I went on
3 to my house.

4 Q Did you ever see Patricia Jeschke after that?

5 A No.

6 MR. ROBB: No further questions.

8 CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. DUNCAN:

9 Q That was about 5 p.m., isn't that correct?

10 A Yes; somewhere in that.

11 Q In that vicinity?

12 A Yes.

13 MR. DUNCAN: Thank you. I have no further
14 questions.

18 HELEN MCGLOTHIN, having been first duly sworn, testified:

19 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. ROBB:

20 Q Would you state your name, please?

21 A Helen McGlothlin.

22 Q Mrs. McGlothlin, first of all, you are the mother of
23 Patricia Jeschke, is that correct?

24 A Yes, I am.

25 Q I want to direct your attention back to November 13, 1980.

1 Do you recall that date?

2 A Yes, I do; very well.

3 Q Did you receive a call from Dorothy Elliott on that day?

4 A Yes, I did.

5 Q After you received this phone call, did you and your hus-
6 band go to your daughter's house?

7 A Yes, we did.

8 Q Mrs. McGlothin, what kind of residence did Patricia Jeschke
9 live in at that time?

10 A It was a-- There was four, well, kind of like duplexes.
11 There was four other apartments there.

12 Q So there was another apartment right next to hers, is that
13 right?

14 A Yes. She lived in the end one. There was three or four
15 west of her.

16 Q She lived on the end, what, closest to Riverside Road?

17 A Yes.

18 Q Now, after you received this call from Dorothy Elliott, you
19 went out to the house, you and your husband, is that
20 correct?

21 A Yes.

22 Q Anybody else with you?

23 A No.

24 Q When you got there, what did you do?

25 A We got out of the car, went to the front door. I rang the

1 doorbell. Nobody answered. I tried the door knob, but it
2 was locked. We went around to the back door. The same
3 thing, the door was locked. We knew that the light was on
4 in the kitchen. We knew the light was on in the bedroom.
5 We knew that something was wrong.

6 Q Her car was still there, wasn't it?

7 A Yes.

8 Q What kind of car?

9 A She had a white MG.

10 Q Was it pure white or more of an off white?

11 A Well, more of an off white.

12 Q Now, after you went to the front door and back door, what
13 did you do next?

14 A My husband went to the bedroom window. He tried to get the
15 screen off. He finally got the screen off. He raised the
16 window. In the meantime I had went to the next apartment
17 from Pat's, asked them if they had seen her that morning.
18 They said no.

19 Q You talked to some neighbors of hers?

20 A Yes.

21 Q Do you recall if this was the Collins, or do you recall
22 their names?

23 A I don't remember their names.

24 Q Did they come over, too?

25 A Yes, they did. They were there when I crawled through

1 the bedroom window.

2 Q Now, the window you crawled through, was that the window
3 into Patricia's bedroom?

4 A Yes, it was.

5 Q All right. After your husband Earl took off the screen
6 and got the window open, you crawled in, is that right?

7 A Yes.

8 Q After crawling in, what did you do?

9 A I went around the foot of the bed, and Pat was laying there
10 on the floor on the left side of the bed.

11 Q All right. After you saw Pat laying there on the floor,
12 what did you do next?

13 A I told Earl, I said, "Pat's dead." I went to the front
14 door to unlock it so that Earl and the two girls could get
15 in.

16 Q When you went to the house on November 13, 1980, got in the
17 house and found Pat there laying the floor dead, did she
18 on that date or before that date, did she have a dog?

19 A Yes, she did.

20 Q What kind of dog did she have?

21 A It's a Shih Tzu

22 Q Is that a small dog?

23 A It's a Chinese dog, real small.

24 Q What color was this real small dog?

25 A It was brown. Well, sort of a tan. More of a tan and

1 white.

2 Q Was it in the house when you went in?

3 A Yes, it was.

4 Q After you opened the door, were the police called?

5 A As soon as my husband and those girls got in, why, one of
6 the girls went to the phone. She asked if we would want
7 her to call the police. I said yes.

8 Q In looking at the house and when you checked the doors, did
9 you see any evidence of forced entry into the house?

10 A No, I didn't.

11 Q Your daughter, that evening, or the evening before, on
12 November 12, 1980, did she have a class she had to go to?

13 A Yes, she did.

14 Q What kind of class was that?

15 A She was studying to be in the Catholic religion. That was
16 at St. Francis Xavier Church.

17 Q Do you recall or do you know what time that class was?

18 A Yes; it was at 7 o'clock, from 7 to 9.

19 Q Do you know whether she attended that class?

20 A No, she didn't.

21 Q Now, I believe the automobile you testified to was on the
22 driveway. Did you go out and determine whether or not the
23 doors to that car were unlocked or locked?

24 A My husband said there was something different, and it was
25 because Pat had always drove the car into the driveway.

1 There wasn't a garage, just a little carport. The car was
2 backed in.

3 Q Was the car door locked or unlocked?

4 A The driver's side was unlocked. He never checked about the
5 other side.

6 MR. ROBB: I have no further questions.

8 CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. DUNCAN:

9 Q Mrs. McGlothin, your daughter was usually particular about
10 locking the car doors?

11 A Yes, she was.

12 Q She was very security minded. In fact, you didn't have a
13 key to her apartment?

14 A We didn't, no.

15 Q As soon as she would get out of that car, that car was
16 locked; that was her normal practice?

17 A That was her normal practice.

18 Q But on that occasion the driver's door was unlocked, and
19 the car was parked in a different way than she would
20 normally park the car?

21 A Yes.

22 Q You described the dog. I take it Pat did not have a cat?

23 A No, she didn't.

24 Q The police on occasion came out and asked you about a
25 hammer that was found there?
