ATTEMPTED STRONG ARM ROBBERY

INFORMATION:

Undersigned Officers were traveling northbound on Genesee near Hartsuff in the City of Saginaw at approximately 8:05 pm on 03-25-98. Undersigned Officers looked to our left, which would be to the west, and observed several black males assaulting another black male that was seated in a yellow 1992 Cadillac Seville. The vehicle was parked on the west side of Genesee just to the north of Hartsuff at a recording studio/pager business. Undersigned Officers were in a un-marked van, pulled into the lot and observed a 1981 white Cadillac with 2 doors open parked directly behind the yellow Cadillac. Officers were fully marked in Gang Task Force sweatshirts along with gunbelts and we identified ourselves as Police Officers immediately upon exiting the vehicle.

Undersigned Officers had their weapons drawn due to the unknown nature of this assault. As Officers were approaching and attempting to stop the subjects in place, several subjects took off running westbound. I was able to knock down one suspect who then got back up and had to be knocked down again. This suspect was wrestled to the ground and finally handcuffed. This suspect was later identified as Dewayne Julks. As the tussle was taking place on the ground, Sgt. VanHorn observed at least two of the original black male suspects that was assaulting the victim in the car, watching me as I struggled with the suspect Julks. Only after Julks was handcuffed by Sgt. VanHorn, did these two subjects continue running westbound.

Assistance was called for other Gang Task Force Officers in the area, who immediately responded and attempting to set up a perimeter to block in the suspects until a tracking dog could arrive. A tracking dog did arrive from Bridgeport Post, Trooper Escot, however the suspects had apparently gotten into a vehicle and left the scene. As Sgt. VanHorn was attempting to arrest Julks, Special Agent Cowley was able to secure one suspect and the victim.

INTERVIEW SUSPECT:

Dewayne Julks was interviewed at the Saginaw City Police Department interview room. Miranda Rights were read at 21:00. Dewayne advised that he lives at 2128 Bancroft in Saginaw and he works for Kelly Services Inc., he makes \$5.75 and his boss's name is Julie. Dewayne advised that his mother's name is Beverly Julks, same address. Dewayne advised that he would speak with Undersigned Officers and he denied any involvement of any knowledge of Thomas, a.k.a. Peter Rabbit Wicker. Dewayne stated that he would not even know Thomas Wicker if he saw him lined up, however he had worked with him on a prior occasion. He continued to advise that he was fighting the victim, Anthony Thomas, and it was over some money that he owed Anthony.

INTERVIEW SUSPECT CONTINUED:

Dewayne started with he owed Anthony \$200.00, Sgt. VanHorn advised Dewayne that I didn't believe this was the case and it probably had something to do with drugs. Dewayne then stated no, however later in the interview stated that it was in fact over some dope, a double up of crack cocaine. Dewayne stated that he was fighting the "light skinned dude," as he described him which would be the victim, however there was another light skinned suspect that Dewayne would not talk about. Dewayne also would not mention anything about "Peter Rabbit." He continually advised that he was just fighting the victim in the car and when the other guys "rolled up" they pushed him up against the car and told Dewayne to stand there.

However, as Sgt. VanHorn and Special Agent Cowley were approaching the scene, it was readily apparent that Dewayne Julks and Thomas Wicker, along with the other light skinned male were all involved in the assault. This was pointed out to Dewayne and he continued to deny and began changing his story. Additional interviews took place with Special Agent Cowley and he on a prior occasion, January 1998, had made contact with Thomas Wicker, Dewayne Julks and a black male named Rosco in a car. Special Agent Cowley pointed this out to Dewayne at which point Dewayne became very nervous and stated that he didn't want to talk anymore. At this point the interview was completed.

LODGED:

Dewayne Julks was lodged in the Saginaw County Jail by Sgt. VanHorn at approximately 11:00 pm, 03-25-98. The charge were listed as: Attempted Strong Armed Robbery.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Sgt. VanHorn, upon returning to the scene of the struggle, observed a small plastic bag that contained a white chunky substance, suspected crack cocaine. This was located underneath a car, right where Sgt. VanHorn was wrestling with Dewayne Julks. This evidence was seized by Sgt. VanHorn and will be placed into evidence for fingerprints, charges sought for Possession of Crack Cocaine.

EVIDENCE:

1 clear plastic baggy, containing approximately 4 rocks of suspected crack cocaine. This will be carried under an additional complaint, 3500 file class, warrants will be sought after prints.

After initially exiting the vehicle, Sergeant Vanhorn apprehended Dewayne Julks as he tried to flee. Following his arrest, a clear plastic baggie containing a number of apparent "rocks" of cocaine was observed lying on the ground beneath Julks.
